- Describe key aspects of the life of the artist.
- Analyse key artworks/photographs. Use examples of artworks.
- Examine the world of the artist.
- Account for the reactions of the audience/s.
- Conclusion- sum up your assessment of the relationship between the artist, her artworks, the world and her audience.
