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DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITIES

You have been invited to be part of an exhibition: ***Australia during the Vietnam War Era – a reflection***. This exhibition will show an image used/published during this time and an outline as to how this image successfully reflected what was happening in Australia at the time of the war.

Part A - provide an image of an aspect of the Vietnam War (from perspective of an Australian serving, an Australian back home or from a Vietnamese at the time of the war). Image must be a minimum of (A5) 15x21cm and maximum of (A4) 30x21cm. Your image **MUST** be approved by your teacher by the start of week 4. Source must be included at bottom of image.

Part B – Write an outline (size 12 font, max 500 words) why this image is significant to understanding the events of Vietnam War era and its impacts upon Australia. In your answer you should address: what significant events or political statements does your image make reference to? What was the purpose of the image? How would the image have affected Australians thoughts of the Vietnam War?

Parts A and B will be pasted on to black A3 cardboard and displayed in classrooms. An example will be provided in class.

Part C – In class, you will be given additional sources and asked to complete a reflection to the following question:

What if these images weren't made available to the Australian public?

In your answer you should discuss:

- the nature and consequences of the Vietnam War on the societies it affected in Australia.
- References should be made to the images provided selected and research completed.

METHOD OF SUBMISSION	<p>Students will paste their sourced image and completed outline on to the cardboard provided in class and submit to teacher.</p> <p>Part C will also take place in class at a time indicated by class teacher during Week 5.</p>
